## FROZEN SUNCATCHERS



#### **KEY IDEAS**

### Make a beautiful frozen art piece using found items and some water!

Skills | fine motor skills; language; curiosity; creativity

Duration | 45-60 minutes, plus time for freezing

Setting | outdoors

**Materials** | items found in nature, shallow pan or container, scissors, string or ribbon, water



#### **ACTIVITY**

- 1. Head outside to collect items for your suncatcher.
  - These could be pinecones, evergreen sprigs, berries, twigs or whatever else you find!
- 2. Bring your items home and lay them out so you can see them all.
- 3. Choose which items you want to put in your suncatcher and arrange them in the bottom of the shallow pan.
  - This could be a cake pan, pie plate, container lid, or any other shallow container.
  - Fill the pan up, or just pick a few of your favourite items.
- 4. Fill the pan with water by pouring it slowly over the items.
- 5. Lay a loop of string or ribbon in the pan.
  - Leave it hanging over the edge so that you can hang your suncatcher once it's frozen.





- 6. Leave the pan outside overnight to freeze, or use your freezer if it isn't cold enough.
- 7. Once the suncatcher is frozen, run a little warm water over the outside of the pan to release it.
- 8. Hang your frozen suncatcher on a branch outside so you can see it sparkle in the sun!



### **QUESTIONS**

- How did you choose which items to put in your suncatcher?
- How do you feel when you look at your finished suncatcher hanging outside?
- Do you think you would find different items if you looked at different times of the year?
  - Why do you think that is?
- How do you think your suncatcher will change as the weather gets warmer?



#### **SAFETY**

- Dress appropriately for playing in the snow. Wear snow pants, a hat, and gloves.
- Ask an adult to help you when cutting or trimming items.
- Ask an adult to help you remove the frozen suncatcher from the pan.
