Materials

- Blank Cards or Cardstock: There are a few options your students could explore. You can buy pre-made blank cards or cut cardstock to your desired size and fold it in half to create a card.
- Art Supplies: Colored pencils, markers, watercolors, or any other preferred art supplies.
- Images or Stamps of Pollinators: Look for images or stamps of bees, butterflies, hummingbirds, or other pollinators online or create your own drawings for a unique touch.
- Nature-themed Stickers: Enhance your card with nature-themed stickers or washi tape, showcasing your artistic nature and environmental skills.
- Other materials include glue or double-sided tape for attaching your images or decorations, and scissors for shaping your card with safety precautions in place.

Nothing is more exciting than creating something from scratch. Here's a simple guide to help you make your own unique card:

Steps:

- **1.Designing the Front of Your Card:** Use your art supplies to craft a nature-themed backdrop on the card's front, be it a garden, meadow, or any scene that embodies pollinators.
- **2. Add Pollinator Images:** Position your selected pollinator images or stamps on the card's front, arranging them aesthetically. If applicable, neatly cut out printed images. You can also **enhance your cards with nature-themed stickers** like flowers, leaves, or other details, using nature-themed stickers.
- **3.Craft a Greeting:** Pen a heartfelt holiday message inside the card. It could also be a poem. Consider incorporating a playful pun or wordplay related to pollinators for a touch of fun. Propose actions to support these essential creatures.
- **4. Personalize the Envelope:** If mailing the card, consider adorning the envelope. Include a small drawing, sticker, or stamp linked to pollinators or nature.
- **5.Sign and Send:** Sign your beautifully designed card, place it in your envelope, and dispatch it to your intended recipient.

Additional Suggestions: You can explore with diverse art styles and color schemes to impart a distinctive feel to your card. Research the migratory patterns of pollinators and their preferred flowers. Alternatively, include pollinator-themed puzzles within the card. If you possess calligraphy skills, consider incorporating it into the card's greeting.
